Puppy Mills and Backyard Breeders

More puppies and kittens are sold during the holiday season than at any other time of year. The Humane Society is happy to see so many homes with new pets. However, we want to make sure our friends understand our concerns with purchasing pets from "puppy mills", "backyard breeders" and "kitty mills." We receive many calls and complaints from pet owners who have purchased pets from these types of businesses.

These operations choose profit over animal welfare and their animals often do not receive proper veterinary care. Animals may seem healthy at first but later may suffer from issues like congenital eye and hip defects, parasites or even the deadly Parvovirus. We want to inform our supporters about these operations and encourage you to adopt from an animal shelter or rescue center. Of the 53 million dogs in the U.S., about two-thirds come from backyard breeders. They are the single greatest cause of the pet overpopulation crisis in this country.

Puppy and kitty mills are commercial breeding facilities that mass-produce dogs and cats for sale directly to consumers through classified ads or the internet. South Carolina does not have laws that regulate commercial breeding kennels that operate for the sole purpose of producing large litters of puppies. Animals that are a part of commercial breeding often spend their entire lives outdoors in poor conditions or inside filthy structures with little to no veterinary care. Females usually have very short, if any, recovery time between litters. When the females can no longer reproduce or when their breed goes out of "style," they are often abandoned or put down.
